Here is our January roundup, a month that will be remembered for having the wettest 10 day period since 1871. Luckily bright orange raincoats had been ordered for this very reason, so the Welcome Ambassador team were able to continue to assist during most of this time!

We welcomed the in person return of JP Morgan for which Welcome Ambassadors were on hand to greet and direct attendees. Despite this being during some of the wettest days this appears to have been a big success! There have also been several large groups at Moscone with Ambassadors guiding attendees to their relevant meetings. The 4th Street corridor continues to be very busy and we have added personnel to help assist with keeping the area safe and clean. The team have been helping give directions and answering questions at both the Chinese New Year flower market and the Lion Dance ceremony at the Ferry Building and of course helping visitors take photos with rabbits.



We continue to look for new Welcome Ambassadors so if you know anyone who would be a great Welcome Ambassador, whether full or part time, please send them our way. We are particularly looking for bilingual referrals, especially Chinese, Spanish, French and German.

We have scheduled some dates to start 2023 training field trips in mid February and will be working with various partners for team members to visit. If you are from a neighborhood, business or attraction that would like to introduce yourself to our team please reach out to me to see what we can arrange either by field trip or in office training.

As a reminder our coverage zone is the area shown on this map, the program operates 7 days per week and hours vary based on location and day of the week, generally between 8am to

8pm in key areas frequented by visitors and office workers. If you have an event, you would like help with, in our coverage zone, please reach out to me.

Health and Safety Summary

We recently added this new section to show you that Welcome Ambassadors do more than just smile and give directions during their daily shifts. They work closely with each area CBD such as Union Square Alliance and Yerba Buena Gardens as part of the network of personnel that offer support for residents and visitors alike to keep our Downtown and tourist areas clean and safe. Many reports are repetitive so you will see some similarities each month.

An Ambassador witnessed a car crash where the driver fled the scent. He called SFPD and remained on the scene to file the report

Emergency services were called by an Ambassador at the request of hotel staff for for an unconscious person in their driveway. He was transported away by ambulance. Welcome Ambassadors assisted with incidents related to car break ins in various neighborhoods, throughout the month by connecting drivers with appropriate services and acting as witnesses when required.

During the month the Welcome Ambassadors conducted 912 welfare checks, offering assistance to all the individuals they connected with. They were also able to intervene and deescalate several altercations without the need to call for further assistance.

We all want to feel proud of our city and can all do our part in reporting anything negative that we see. For non-emergencies please make sure you have the 311 app on your phone to report anything such as street conditions, overflowing garbage containers as well as disturbances due to mental health issues. If you see something, say something.
